1. All animals must be owned by the exhibitor, caged and entered before the show. All market animals will be sold.
2. General rules and regulations as stated on previous pages.
3. Check-in time: 8:00 a.m. on Wednesday.
Check-out time: Saturday after the market sale.
4. Animals may be reassigned cages at the discretion of the superintendent.
5. Rabbits will be shown by breed with a class for mixed breed.
6. Two entries per class, per breed.
7. Coop numbers will be assigned at check-in.
8. Day-of-show changes will only be allowed in same breed/same class.
9. Exhibitors are asked to bring their own food and water containers.
10. No Rabbits under the age of 3 months can be shown.
11. Absolutely no Does with litters in the barn.
12. Rabbits that you wish to sell must be a minimum of 8 weeks old.
13. Youth Points 5-4-3.
14. Open Class \$1.25, \$1.00, \$0.75

CLASSES:

1. Meat Pen (3 fryers under 5 lbs. each)
2. Junior Buck (3-6 months)
3. Junior Doe (3-6 months)
4. 6-8 Buck (6-8 months)
5. 6-8 Doe (6-8 months)
6. Senior Buck (over 8 months)
7. Senior Doe (over 8 months)

Divisions will be decided after all entries are received. Rabbits will show in the arena.

Division H - Agriculture Mechanics

REGULATIONS

1. Entries are limited to Texas and surrounding counties FFA and youth Exhibitors.
2. All items exhibited must be shown as to allow easy access for judging and viewing or no premium money will be allocated to those specific entries.
3. Articles exhibited must have been constructed by the FFA or youth exhibitor, either as part of their farm mechanics instruction in vocational agriculture, or as a part of their supervised farming programs.
4. Entries will be judged on the basis of workmanship, design and appearance.
5. Exhibits must have been constructed or refurbished in the last 12 months and must have not been exhibited at this fair before.
6. Each exhibitor is limited to two entries in each class.
7. Exhibits in place by Wednesday. Released Saturday after livestock auction.
8. All items exhibited must be "constructed": reconditioned items will be accepted.
9. Items for exhibit which may be added to an item shown last year, such as a wagon bed for exhibit placed on a wagon shown the previous year, must be clearly indicated on the entry form by the instructor. Failure to do this will cause disqualification of all items exhibited from that school.
10. \$7.00 entry fee will be charged for all Agriculture Mechanics exhibits. Any Agriculture Mechanics exhibits sold at the fair will have a 5% commission deducted from sale proceeds. Blue ribbons will receive a \$7.00 premium. The Grand Champion of the Agriculture Mechanics classes will receive a \$14.00 premium.
11. Items which are removed before the indicated time or not properly released will result in the loss of premium of the items.
12. The Fair Committee reserves the right to refuse any exhibit it deems inappropriate for exhibition.
13. It will be left to the discretion of the Agriculture Mechanics superintendent to classify exhibits as Agriculture Mechanics or Home Economics exhibits.
14. It shall be the responsibility of exhibitors and their instructors to see that all items are properly identified.
15. There is a **maximum total** of 6 premium payouts **per individual** in the Divisions of Horticulture, Field Crops, Agriculture Mechanics, Home Economics and Junior Fair.

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
